

What an amazing year it has been for the Under-9s Team Dickinson!

When we first arrived at training earlier this year, there were around 40 kids on the oval, all eager to play. Straight away, it was clear we needed two teams. And so, we became Team Ignatenko and Team Dickinson. Our team, Team Dickinson, was only put together a week before the very first game. That meant a big scramble to find a team manager, a runner, an umpire, and plenty of volunteers just to make sure our kids could take the field. Thanks to some incredible people stepping up, we pulled it all together.

We trained every Wednesday night, and with 40 to 50 kids between both teams, things could get a little chaotic at times! Some weeks we trained alongside Team Ignatenko, and other weeks it was just Team Dickinson. Training sessions were always packed with fun, games, and plenty of skill work, and it was fantastic to see the kids improve their kicking, hand balling and marking as the year went on.

With players coming from a variety of schools, the team became a great chance to make new friends while sharing a common love of footy. Many of our kids were Under-8s stepping up to play in the Under-9s competition, which could have been seen as a disadvantage, but instead they embraced the challenge. For most, this was their very first season of football, with only a handful returning for their second year which made the improvement and teamwork on display even more special.

When Round One arrived, those first few games were a real learning experience. The kids had to adjust to competition football quickly learning how to tackle, be tackled, handle pressure, and play by the rules. It was a big step up from kicking the ball around at school! But as the season went on, the team grew stronger, more skilled, and more confident every week. Honestly, every player could have won the Most Improved Player medal.

Our second-season players (Asher V, Miles, Wrishaen, Jett, Charlie, Isaac, Ethan, and Sasha) stood tall as leaders, guiding the first-year kids and showing them the way. Their leadership and teamwork were outstanding, and I couldn't be prouder. Our first-year players (Zane A, Lochie, Asher P, Jai, Zach, Corey, Isaiah, Aayuthan, Leo, Jayden, Rafa, Stratis, and Zayn M) all made incredible contributions, both as individuals and as team players. Their dedication and determination were clear every single week, and they should all be very proud of what they achieved this season.

A real highlight for all of us was singing the Hawks team song three times this year. The smiles on the kids' faces and the energy they brought to those moments were simply magical. This year has shown us all the value of team sport, not just the skills of kicking, hand balling, and marking, but the qualities of leadership, teamwork, resilience, and friendship. These are things the kids and even us adults will carry forward long after this season.

To our players, families, coaches, and volunteers, thank you. You made this season what it was. And to the kids, congratulations on everything you've achieved. We can't wait to see what you bring to the field in 2026!

To round out the home and away season, we played the only team we had defeated in the competition, St. Bede's. There was a fantastic crowd and plenty of support for the boys, which drove them to get over the line and tick off one of our goals which was to beat every side in the comp.

An elimination final against East Sandringham followed, in which the boys were competitive for a half, but unfortunately East Sandringham were too good on the day. As I said after the game, I hope the final game does not define the season, rather they use it as motivation to continue to work harder and become better people and young men. The development and growth across the season by all players is a testament to the boy's commitment and determination.

Congratulations to Jack Gifford, Kai Phibbs, Dylan Toohey and Oliver Hickey who participated in the SMJFL Intraleague program.

Good luck to those who suffered significant injuries during the year and their recovery – Jayden, Thomas and Kai.

In finishing I would like to thank all the parents for their support throughout the season. I appreciate all the support you gave to myself and the coaching team. To Andrew for your support, assistance and always being there for advice was greatly appreciated. To Shaye & Marie for trainer duties during the season and all other parents for filling volunteer roles. To Kylie for her support and role of manager, I am truly grateful and appreciate your tireless efforts.

I hope to see all players and parents next year as we look to continue this football journey with a fantastic group of families.

TEAM COCHRANE - OUR STORY

Before a ball was bounced, the U15 Boys and their families undertook a recruitment drive like no other – typical of the group's spirit that would light up 2025. We added seven to the group, setting two teams, with an unreal total of six new-to-football players that would each develop a story of their own and together create a bond forever.

We started the season with 21 players, which would be our season high, and dipped as low as 16 starters. But the support of Team Phibbs (U14s) would prove a valuable lifeline and truly connect the boys as friends rather than fill-ins across two teams. Thank you Noah, Tommy, Jarryd, Jack, Kai and Dylan, plus Kylie, Ben and Andrew – you allowed us to dream.

We won three of four grading games – proving we have more than just potential – and were elevated to Division 4 after a restructure. In R1 Aidan won the ANZAC medal showcasing speed & drive to challenge anyone in his way as we defeated Mordi-Brae. R2 and it was Christian taking grass from half back then half forward to bag three goals and best on ground as we defeated Ajax. R3 was a thumping as we kicked 22 goals to beat East Sandringham, with 12 goalkickers, but it was the dash and creativity of Will O that caught the eye as he announced himself as a player to watch – electric!

A few hard-fought losses followed but we kept seeing improvements as numbers grew at training, players locked in and started to see the fundamentals transfer into consistent performances from the likes of Will S in the ruck and as a tackling machine, Levi attacking from half back, Tarkyn (C) leading the way as an inside-mid, and Riley M and Owen splitting wings. We would end one game with 14 players and only lose by 9 points – a brave group – but continue to train hard, create our own stoppage plays, and reset a training plan to become more predictable to each other as we set a goal to be brave and run the ball.

By mid-season our skills started to show as the young men connected chains by hand and foot and our disciplined structure became a threat with a season-high 20 marks by Logan in defence and a hotspot goal from Joseph (VC) to take down Mordi-Brae again, this time by 5 points. Joey would finish the season with 30 goals (plus 3 in the upper division) scoring in every game except one – a super consistent rising star!

After many developing roles, Archer found elite form as a high half forward tick-leading toward goal, Ethan's footy IQ sparked rebounding attacks, Matteo won all his contests, Lucas became a drop-off intercepting defender, Ben started hitting the scoreboard, and James' pressure saved gaols. We unearthed a gem in Lok as a reliable ruck and key position threat in defence and attack, while Tom O started to shine as a contested beast with pacey runners like Zahn flying by in support – predictable front & centre play.

We found our rhythm. Teams feared us – and rightly so! Our run home was inspiring. We had clutch moments from Jordan, a 60m torp on the siren to topple ladder leaders Stk City by 2 points. We had untitled leaders step up and grow in confidence with Riley C taking a running bounce down the wing one week and fending off opponents the next. We had speeches from Rob Blangiardo, aka the "heart", as hawks jumpers appeared from nowhere. We had spirit, energy and fun playing the game our way, our brand, our DNA.

We fell just short of finals, finishing fifth, but we achieved so much more. This group developed as footballers and friends and will forever have a story to tell. Thank you all for letting me play a role in our story. I will cherish all the special moments we shared.

Our season started slowly, with only 11-12 girls showing up for preseason training in early February. Each week we'd arrive, hoping a new player would magically appear. Daisy delivered classy performances every week and Lexi's toughness and run from half-back were unmatched. Shantel brought speed through the middle, and Heather's confidence bloomed - capped off by her first career goal. Rhi played five games when work allowed and was a valuable contributor.

Big thanks to our U16 girls who stepped up: Julia (5 games), Scarlett, Bella, Georgia, and Layla all made valuable contributions. We appreciated your help and look forward to seeing you shine in 18s next year.

A major turning point came in Round 12. Facing Beaumaris - who beat us by 75 points in Round 5 - we showed how far we'd come. Although we lost by 15, it felt like a win and gave us real confidence. From there, we only lost one more game in the home-and-away season (to St Peter's in Round 13). A big Round 14 win over SMDJFC and a dominant victory in Round 15 against Prahran saw us leap into the finals.
